We always stress to our kids that we will always be there for them throughout life, and this was a practical opportunity to show not just her, but all of them that it is true. Finally, and most importantly, I got one more chance to share an Easter message with all of them. There could truly be nothing better then getting to talk about The Gospel with a bunch of people we care so deeply about!

In last month's newsletter, I was vulnerable and shared about the recent frustrations of leading our Teen Parents group. Since that article, God has moved in the hearts of the young moms and dads and in the relationships amongst the group in a variety of ways. There is still work to be done but it is encouraging to see progress and to see the young people put down their guard and pick up compassion and peace.

Which is a good segue to this month: I am switching gears back to sharing some of the more positive things happening at Garage Ministry.

I want to share three little snippets of conversations and interactions that happened at last night's Teen Parent's support group.

First, our meeting started with one of the moms coming in sitting down and immediately blurting out...."your husband is having quite the impact on my boyfriend. He will not stop watching inspirational videos...and it's getting quite annoying, actually." She was laughing but also clearly irritated. We helped her unpack what was going on and pointed out the positives... and the things that could be "tweaked." Both she and her boyfriend have been asking many questions about what it truly means to have a relationship with Christ. It's cool that her boyfriend is wanting to learn even more about God...and cool that she also is hearing Truth as he watches the videos. She was surprised one of the videos he was watching was talking about temptations and how to avoid them, and she said he doesn't even struggle with those temptations. I explained that awareness and accountability and avoiding situations that could lead to problems are things Jim has discussed with the guys. We then talked about how ALL of us have temptation to sin, and we are all sinners. We pointed out that it was cool that her boyfriend was eager to learn more about staying on a healthy path. And we acknowledged that he could be doing much worse things on his phone. She was able to see the positive sides of his new found past time. We then talked about the excessive amount of time he is watching these and boundaries she could suggest.

The second thing that stood out about the meeting was that the girls all came alone. The one usually does, but the other two usually bring their babies and their boyfriends. The girls shared that the guys said they saw that their girlfriend's needed a break and a girl's night, so they stayed back at one of the houses to play with all the kids! Jim certainly missed having the guys there, but at the same time, was proud of them for stepping up and noticing and then supporting the moms of their babies. These young men were acting on some of the things they have been talking about in their group sessions.

The final standout of the meeting actually took place after the close of our meeting. Two of the moms opened up privately about different hard things they were facing. They were able to vent in a safe space, share their struggles and fears and have help coming up with a game plan to move forward!

Some of these things can seem simple on the surface. However, for young people who have only seen dysfunction being modeled as they were growing up, these little coping skills and communication techniques they are learning are monumental. And will then be carried on to a new generation, replacing unhealthy ones.

What a privilege that God ALLOWS us to help guide these young people! Thank you to all of you who support us and make this happen!
